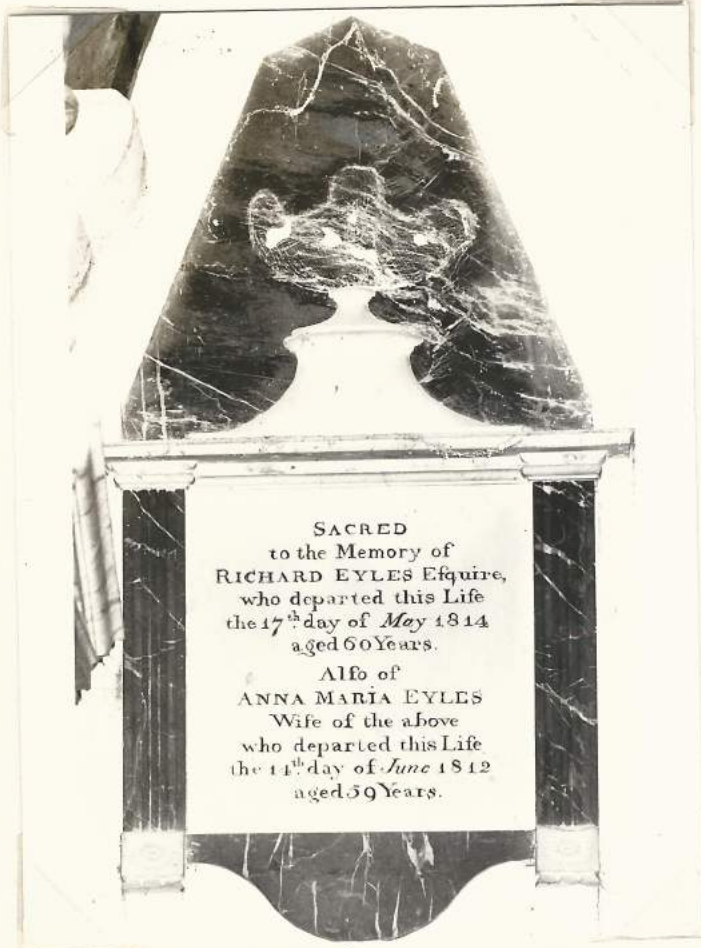

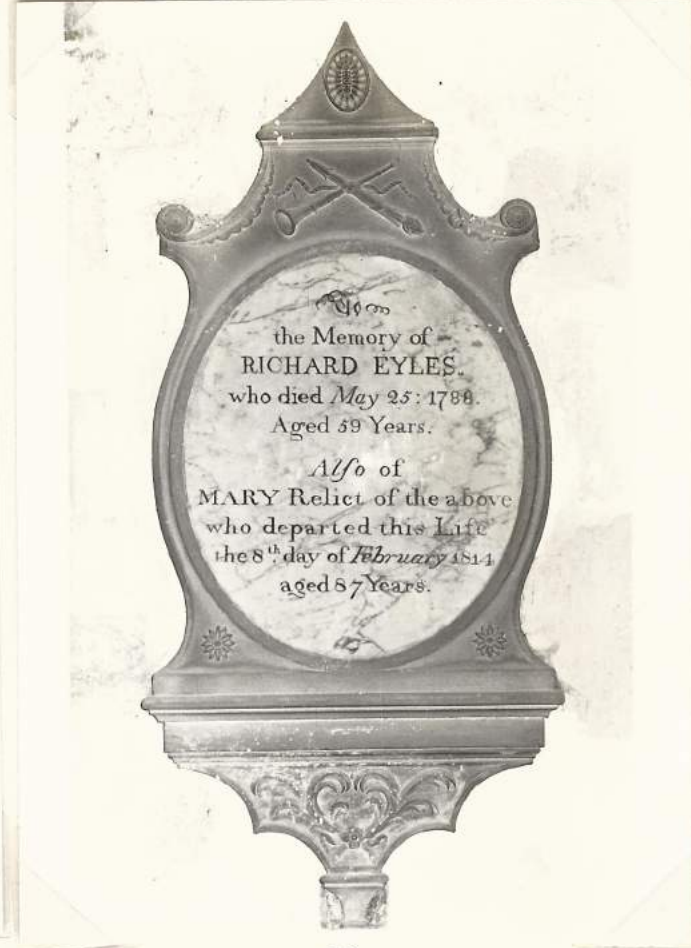

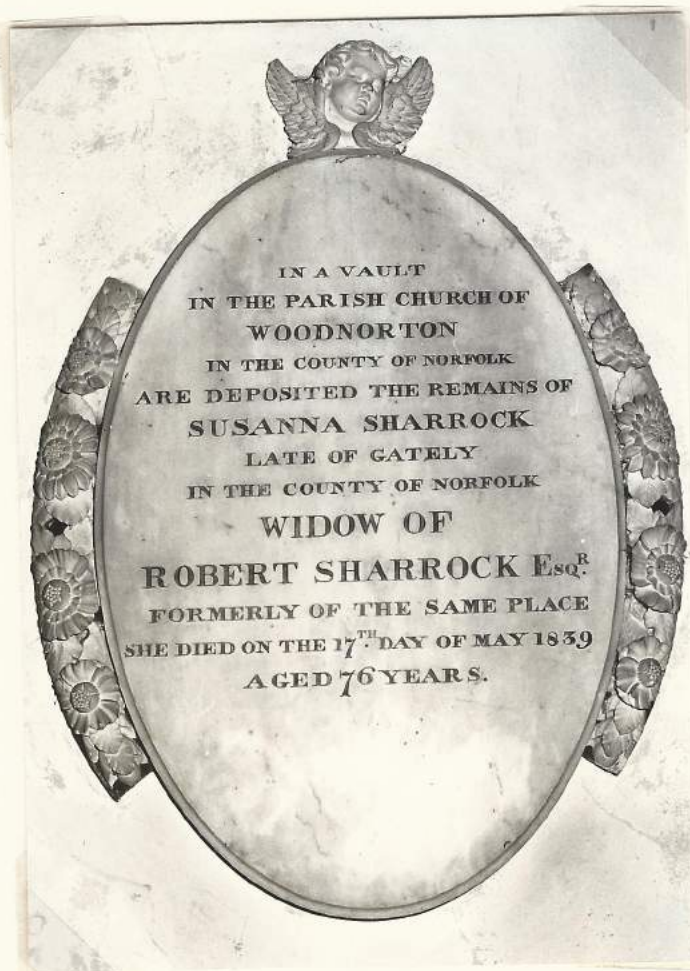

In the fame Vault lieth alfo the body of THOMAS BONHAM SMITH (only/Son of THOMAS BONHAM SMITH Esqr; of Mareland) who exchanged this/mortal life for immortality July 18th; 1742 in the 7th year of his age.
This monument is erected in purfuance of the last will and teftament of THOMAS/BONHAM SMITH Efqr of Mareland, the younger of the two Sons of Mr JOHN/BONHAM firft above mentioned: and the infcription is thereon engraved ac-/cording to the directions of the fame will; having been intended by the Teftator/as a teftimony of the affectionate remembrance with which he thought of his/Father, Mother and Son, to the end of his life./He died on the 14th day of January 1764 and in the 55th year of his age: and was/depofited in the fame vault with thofe his relations.
